Re: AB 313 (Gray): Water - SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Gray:

The above listed organizations support your Assembly Bill 313, which would upgrade the state's water management structure and restore fairness that all water right holders deserve.

AB 313 would address issues with and upgrade the administration of California's water rights and enforcement programs, and the management of our water infrastructure and groundwater resources. This measure would remove conflicts of interest in the existing system where state agencies operate as judge, jury and prosecutor.

AB 313 proposes to restructure the administration and enforcement of water rights and the State Water Project. Currently responsibilities and enforcement authority are found throughout various departments of government that sometimes work in opposite directions. The current system of managing California's water, our most precious resource, simply does not work.

The current system provides the State Water Resources Control Board authority over allocating water rights and permits, enforcing those rights and allocating the punishment, if they believe there has been a violation by a water user. This action is intended to be quasi judicial. However, when water rights hearings held by appointed water board members used their own staff as investigator and prosecutor while the board members themselves acted as judge and jury. Additionally, they have inadequate structural separations of duties to effectively serve the quasi judicial functions. The current system creates an inherent challenge for the board to provide a fair hearing and appropriate judicial review when the board serves as investigator, judge, jury and prosecutor. AB 313 has several elements to assist in creating appropriate balance including moving the permitting to the Department of Water Resources and providing for Superior Court review.

The bill attempts to reform the system and promote efficiency and fairness. By moving some of the functions and reforming the system, the water board can focus on important issues such as water quality.

In closing, we support the intent of AB 313 and its approach to addressing the conflicts of interest and inherent biases in the current system and look forward to working with you and the legislature to reform the current broken system.
